APRIL WORSHIP

In April we turn from Lenten reflection to Easter joy. On Palm-Passion Sunday, we will hear Luke's version of the story of Jesus's last week in Jerusalem, from his triumphal entry into the city to his crucifixion and death.

Our Holy Week services will be shared with Hillsboro UMC. Maundy Thursday, at Hillsboro, commemorates Jesus's last supper with his disciples and the institution of Holy Communion. Good Friday, in our sanctuary, focuses on Jesus's passion and death. Both services will be bilingual English and Spanish.

As we celebrate Jesus's triumph over death through resurrection, you are encouraged to bring flowers from your yard for the floral cross. Bring them up front before the service starts to help create a representation of Easter joy.

Dear friends,

e find ourselves in a period of the unknown regarding COVID. We give thanks that the Omicron wave is receding. COVID levels in Washington County are now as low as they have been since last summer, before the rise of the Delta Variant. State masking mandates have been lifted. According to the CDC, our county is currently at "low" COVID risk.

At the same time, there is some trepidation. Now that many precautions are being lifted, will we see an increase in COVID spread? What happens if another variant develops? Also, we know that our congregation is older, and therefore at higher risk from COVID. What is the responsible way forward?

We are moving ahead cautiously. Starting on March 20th, masks are optional for in-person worship. However, masks are still encouraged, especially for singing.

We are keeping a close eye on the COVID data for our area. If the risk increases, expect that we may return to increased precautions, including masking. And if, as we all pray it does, the risk from COVID continues to decrease, we will relax precautions based on public health guidance.

As we respond to current conditions, our COVID precautions may change, even from week to week. We'll keep you updated with the latest information on the front page of our church website: *umcforestgrove.org*. By Thursday of each week, there should be a solid announcement about what to expect on the following Sunday.

Thank you for grace and patience in this uncertain time. Please pray for us all as we seek an end to this pandemic.

- They've also found creative ways to help Ukrainian friends and family members, and they've shared with The United Methodist Church their expertise in the region's complicated politics and history.

For United Methodists with close ties to Ukraine, the Russian invasion of that country is an ever-present, wrenching concern, keeping them tethered to news reports and social media, and costing them sleep. It's also an occasion to try to help, however far they may be from the war itself.
