FINANCE UPDATE



The finance committee with approval from the church council has decided to take an additional draw of 5% for the balance of the year to support day to day operations. The draw from our Edward Jones account will be taken in two phases starting immediately. This is necessary to maintain expenses due to lower-than-expected givings for this year.



I also just became aware of QCD's which may be a tax advantage for some of our members. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a distribution from a Traditional or Roth IRA made directly by the IRA trustee to a qualified charitable organization when the IRA owner is age 70 ½ or older. A QCD may satisfy the client's required minimum distribution (RMD) and up to \$100,000 of QCDs may be excluded annually from an individual's taxable income.

Making a QCD provides an opportunity to make a charitable contribution that you might otherwise not have been able to make and/or receive potential tax benefits for charitable contributions that you are already making. You should consult your tax advisor and estate planning attorney about your situation.
